## A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

---

In 1939 Lord Egerton of Tatton donated 320 hectares of land to the Department of Agriculture for the establishment of an Agricultural School. The first buildings were constructed in 1940/1941 and the first 3 students were admitted in 1941. Those early students were British ex-service men returning from World War II who were being prepared for farming in the Kenya Highlands. Initially, courses were informal and only in the mid 1940s were formal 9 month certificate Courses introduced. In 1949 the Diploma in Agriculture, was initiated and thereafter, new Diploma Courses have been added from time to time until today there are 12 different specializations.

In 1955 the Government handed over the Management of the College to a Board of Governors. When Lord Egerton died in 1958, he left the College a further 1125 hectares of land.

In 1960, when it was obvious that Kenya's political independence was inevitable, the constitution had to be amended and the Board reorganized to allow the College, which was up till then an exclusive European preserve, to admit non-European students beginning 1961. Training was also focused more sharply on the needs and aspirations of an independent Kenya.

The College has continued to grow in student numbers, staff, physical facilities as well as in the number and type of specialist courses offered. Today, there are 787 students drawn from Kenya and 13 other African countries at the College. The present College plan envisages a student enrolment of 1600 by 1983. This phenomenal growth is a reflection of the importance the Kenya Government attaches to agricultural development and the readiness of Egerton College to respond to the national needs for agricultural training.
